

KENTUCKY ANIMAL CONTROL ADVISORY BOARD
2011 Grant Application for Animal Control Officer Training
General Information

It is the Board's intent to meaningfully assist as many counties as possible. The following entities may apply:

- 1. County Governments**
- 2. Urban-county Governments**
- 3. Non-profit organizations that have a valid contract to provide animal control/sheltering for county/municipal governments**

Applicants for grant funds shall:

1. Employ an animal control officer who has completed, or who will complete within one year, minimum training requirements set forth by the Animal Control Advisory Board.
2. Have an established animal control program in place or present a plan to establish an animal control program.
3. Meet minimum animal sheltering standards as established by the Board including adequate daily feeding, watering, and cleaning as required by KRS 258.119.
4. Provide access to the public for no less than twenty-four (24) hours in one week.
5. Employ euthanasia methods recommended by the American Veterinary Medical Association. Gunshot, as a method for routine euthanasia in an animal shelter, is prohibited by law.
6. Keep accurate statistical records on animals entering the shelter and their disposition.
